Please note that public comment is not intended for a discussion or a question-and-answer session with the Board. Additionally, when making a public comment, please identify yourself and whether you are speaking individually or on behalf of an organization. Meeting Agenda for June 30, 2022, 10:00 am

Identify agency rules and enabling statutes that operate as unnecessary barriers to entry or diversity in the profession and possible solutions to these barriers that are within the agency's regulatory authority; and conduct discussion and develop recommended changes to reduce or eliminate administratively burdensome regulations in psychology that are no longer favored regulatory approaches, or lack an appropriate evidentiary basis.

Please note that the Board may not discuss or take action on any matter raised during public comment, except to decide whether to place the matter on the agenda of a future meeting.

Discussion Topics for Special Called PSY Bd. Meeting

The following issues have been identified by agency staff as potential starting points for the Board's discussion at its June 30th meeting. This list should not be construed as an affirmative recommendation that the rules or statutes identified must or should be changed.

It is important to note that the Board may choose which discussion points it will address and to what extent, and the Board may identify its own discussion points so long as they fall within the purview of the meeting agenda and the agency's jurisdiction.

Applicable to All License Types

Rule Changes:

- Whether to maintain the jurisprudence exam as a pass/fail exam or to transition to a no-fail exam like those utilized by the MFT, LPC, and Social Work boards. 463.30
 - Alternatively, whether to maintain or revise the current pass rate of 90% for the juris exam for all license types. 463.31
- The limiting effect of requiring LP and LPA applicants to apply with the agency first when seeking approval to sit for the EPPP exam.
 - This issue is derived from ASPPB's decision to require all exam approvals to come directly from the regulatory board, rather than ASPPB.

Licensed Psychologists

Statutory Changes:

- Whether the post-doctoral year is still necessary given the education, training, and skills acquired by students who undergo a year of internship as part of their doctoral training, together with the trend within the profession and other jurisdictions of moving away from requiring a post-doctoral year? 501.2525(a)(2)(A)
- Whether the 5 year practice requirement for expedited licensure for LPs licensed in another jurisdiction is a reasonable requirement? <u>501.2525(c)(2)</u>
- Whether the supervision requirement for temporary licensure is necessary for public protection when issuing a temporary license to an individual who is already licensed and in good standing in another jurisdiction. 501.263 and 463.12

Rule Changes:

- Whether to maintain the requirement of 3,500 hours of supervised experience for LP licensure when only 3,000 hours is required for applicants licensed in another jurisdiction and under the remediation rule. 463.11(a), 463.10(e), and 463.11(g)
- Whether to maintain or revise the restrictions on practicum hours that may be credited toward the post-doc year requirement. 463.11(b)(1)(B)(i)-(viii)
- Whether to maintain or revise the Gap Rule found at 463.11(c)(2).
- Whether to maintain or revise each of the internship criteria set out under <u>463.11(d)(2)</u> and (3). When reviewing these criteria the question "Is this needed to ensure safe, entry level practice for psychologists?" should be considered for each.

Licensed Psychological Associates

Rule Changes:

- Whether to maintain or revise the coursework requirement for LPA licensure set out in 463.8(a)(4). Are the six categories, with subcategories, listed in the rule needed for safe, entry level supervised practice?
- Whether to maintain or revise the 60 hour degree requirement for LPA licensure 463.8(b)(2). Previously 42 credit hour degrees were acceptable, see 463.8(g).
- Whether to maintain or revise the 3,000 hours of post-graduate supervised experience required under 463.8(c) before granting independent practice authority.

Licensed Specialists in School Psychology

Statutory Changes:

 Whether <u>501.260(a)</u> operates as an unreasonable barrier to appropriately trained LPs and LPAs by requiring them to be dually licensed as an LSSP before delivering school psych. services.

Rule Changes:

- Whether the restriction on LSSPs delivering services outside of the public/private school context (465.38(c)) is necessary to ensure public protection in light of the competency requirements set out in 465.9.
- Whether to maintain or revise the coursework requirement for LSSP licensure set out in 463.9(e). Are the seven categories, and their subcategories, listed in the rule needed for safe, entry level practice when 501.260(b)(2) lists five categories?
